Dan Crawford, the explorer missionary, tells how, when his African companions were on a march and night came on, they would lie down by the trail and sleep. Before dropping off to rest, they would pass from group to group the watchword, "Lutenda."

The word means "morning star." There was an agreement among them to be up and ready to move when the morning star appeared. To Dan Crawford this was a parable. To all believers Christ is the Bright and Morning Star. (Revelation 22:16.) To those who lie down in their last sleep, with hearts and minds fixed on Christ, comes blessed hope.
